Daniel and Kate Johnston

Jeffcoat Pottery is pleased to announce their winter workshop with ceramic artists, Daniel and Kate Johnston. Living and working in their log cabin house/studio in Seagrove, NC, the couple draws inspiration from traditional forms in clay while creating their own contemporary works.



Daniel was hired as a production thrower by Cole Pottery in Seagrove when he was 16. He apprenticed with Mark Hewitt from 18-22 years old, with time spent in England working with Clive Bowen and Svend Bayer; all three are part of the Michael Cardew lineage. Daniel also studied in the village of Pon Bok in Thailand to learn their technique for making traditional large water jars. Johnston explains, “I do not try to control my materials, rather I try to understand them. From digging the clay to firing the kiln, I put all my effort into creating pots that have a powerful presence. It is important to me to create pots that are timeless but reflect the culture and times in which we live.”

Kate grew up in Millville, NJ and began assisting plein air painter Patricia Witt at the age of 9. She discovered clay and talked her way into a

studio assistantship with potter Terry Plasket at Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center in Millville. At age 16, she became Wheaton Arts’ youngest ever production potter. Kate left the studio to earn a BFA at Alfred University. In 2010, Kate opened her pottery studio in Seagrove, NC. Kate’s pots are made with local materials, boldly carved with organic patterns inspired by Art Deco design. “My carving process starts with a solid layer of slip on the still wet piece. I carve the border first and then the main pattern, slowly taking away the background and allowing the design to emerge.”

Both Daniel and Kate have shown their work, lectured, and taught throughout NC and the country. Daniel has also created several large projects and installations, such as his *100 Large Jar Project* and more recently his *Installation (906-955) White to Black* at Peter’s Projects, in Santa Fe, NM. They have been featured in *Ceramics Monthly* magazine.



In this two-day demonstration workshop, Daniel and Kate will concentrate on throwing a variety of forms, including those with lids and handles. Surface treatments such as slip-trailing, carved patterns, inlaid slip designs, and painting with glaze will also be demonstrated. A discussion of their work and process, including a slide presentation, will be included in the weekend. Hopefully, Daniel or Kate will also delight us in making one of their big pots!
